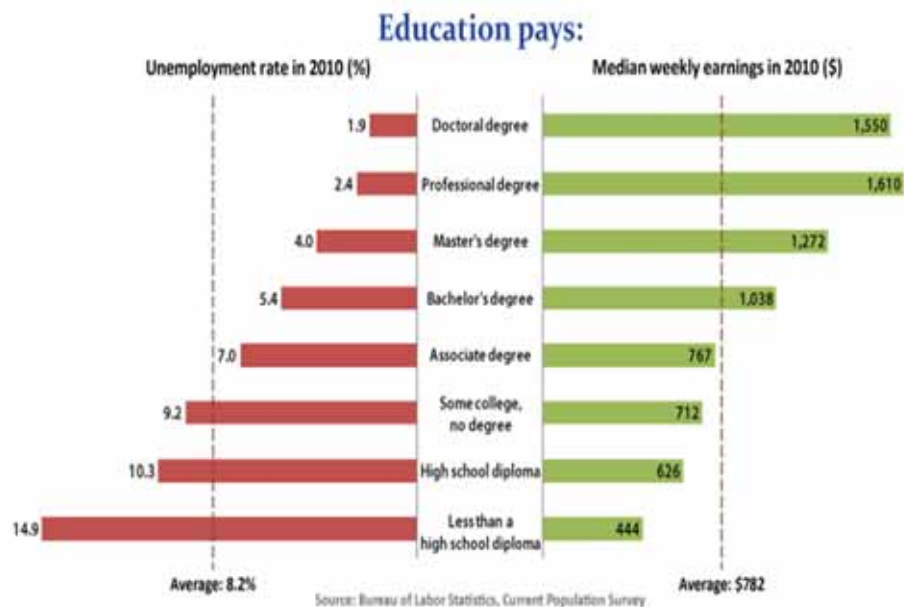
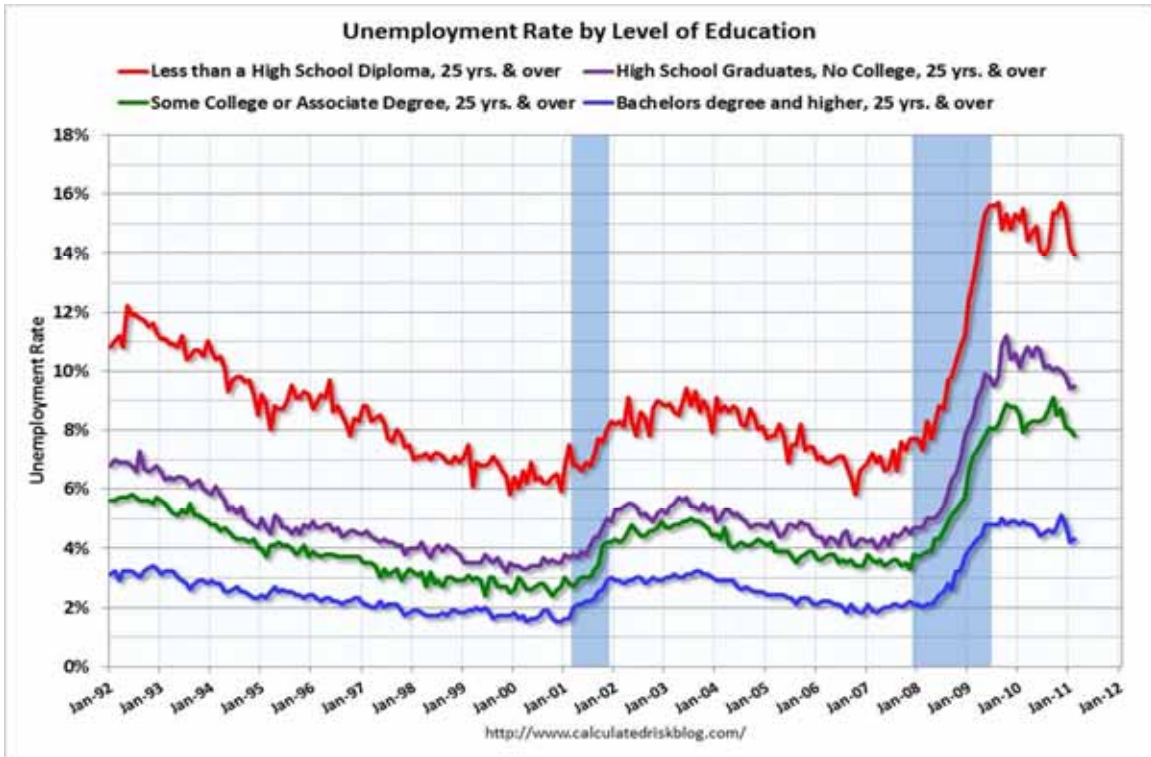

Unemployment & Earnings by Attainment



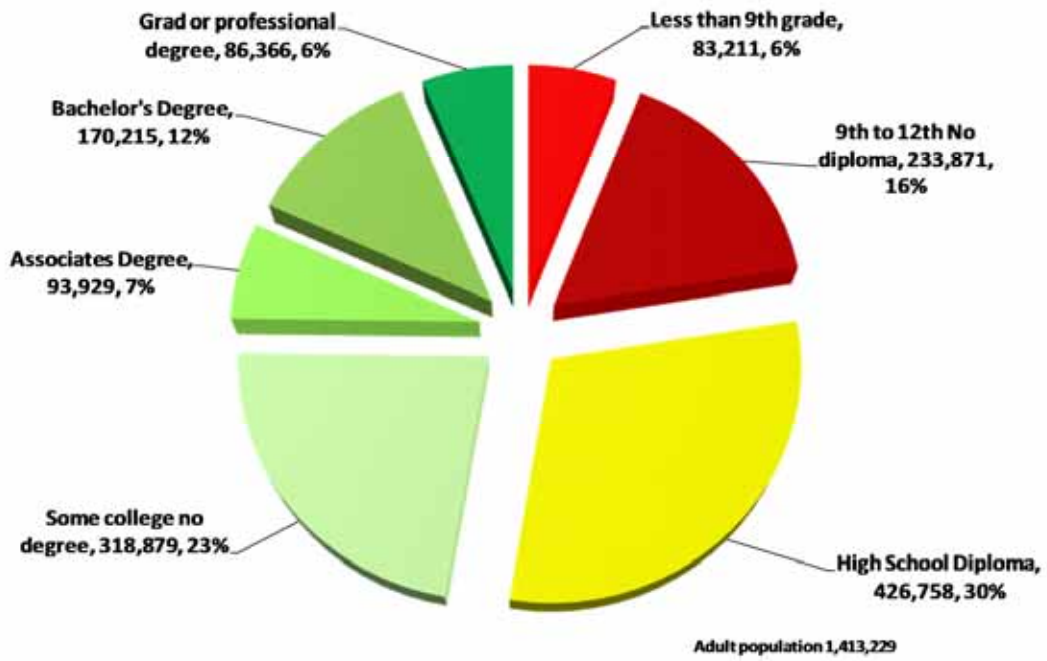


Comparing MISSISSIPPI with nations and other states in the percentage of young-adult degree attainment (ages 25-34)

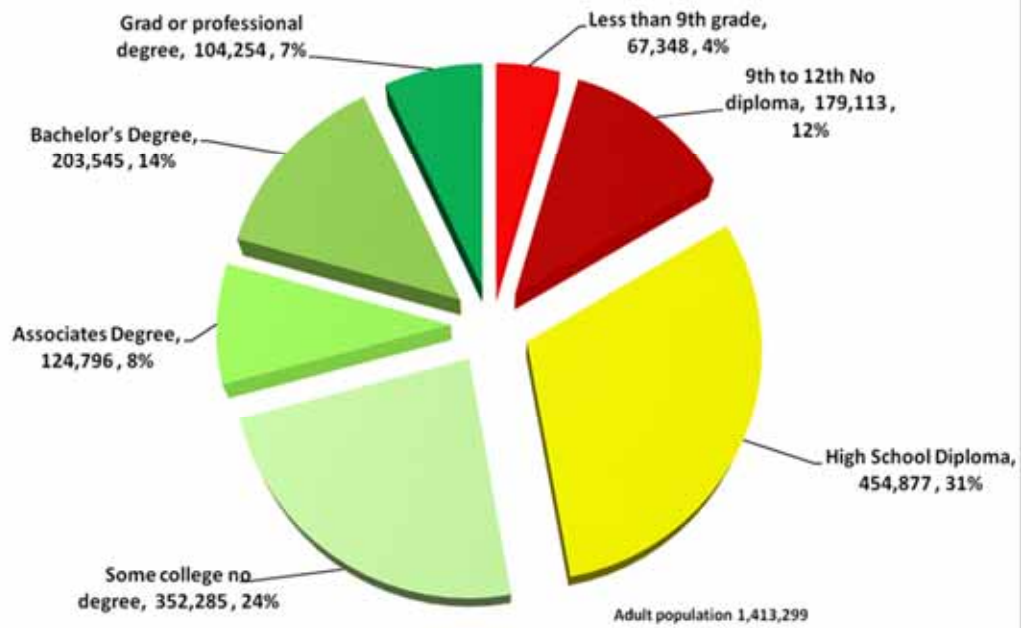

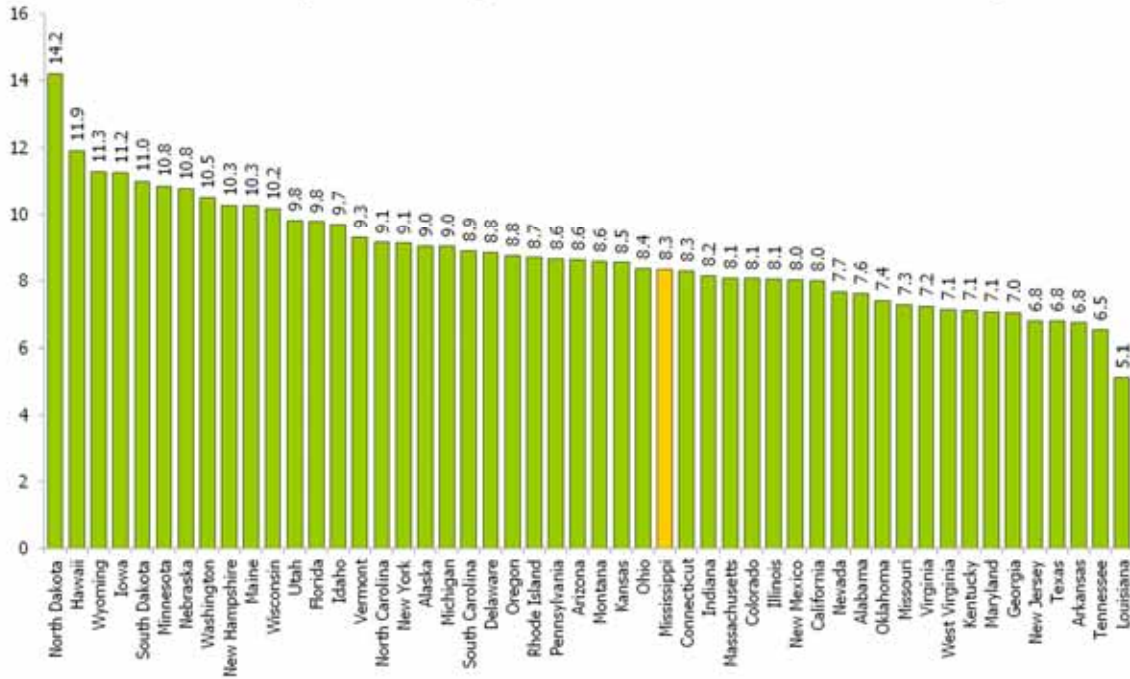
Levels of Education for Mississippi 25-64 year old Adults, 2009

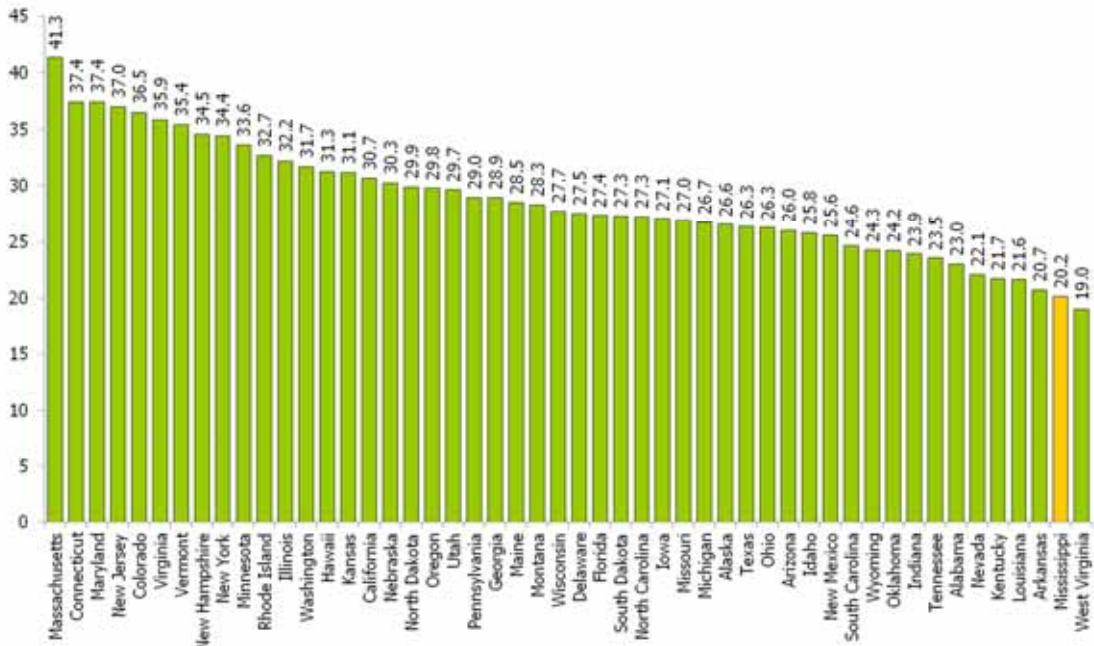

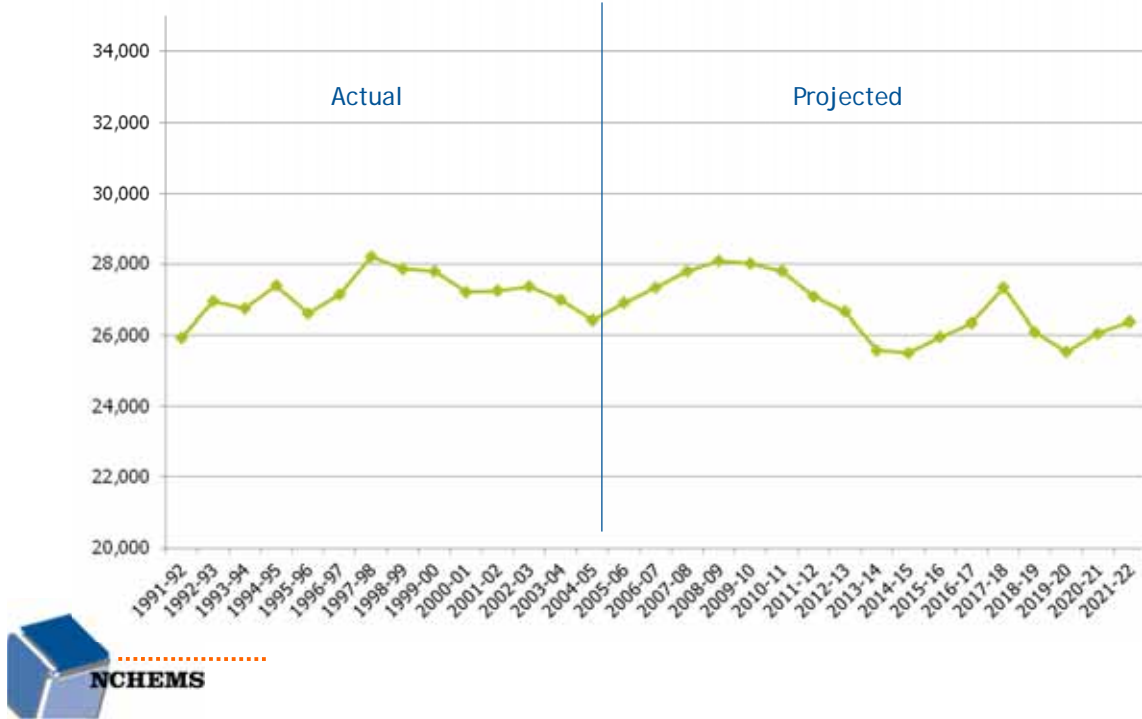
Percent of Population Ages 25-64 with Bachelor's Degree or Higher

- **Lumina Foundation "Big Goal"**—60% of the adult population aged 25-65 by 2025
- **SREB**-60% of the adult population aged 25-65 by 2025
- **Complete College America**—60% of the adult population aged 25-34 by 2020
- **Mississippi Goal**
 - National Average (projected 46.5%) by 2025
 - 60% Adults ages 25-64 by 2025
